Subject: "A Delay Doesn't Mean Denial"

Scriptures: 2 Corinthians 1:20

"For no matter how many promises God has made, they are "yes" in Christ. And so, through him, the "amen" is spoken by us to the glory of God"

Introduction: Has God ever promised you something? But it seems nothing happened, that everything is at a standstill and you can't figure it out. In fact, your circumstances turned for the worse. Now you are doubting yourself.

Did you misinterpret God's intentions? Was it all in your head? Where are the promised blessings? If God promised it, believe it. A delay is not denial, but a time of preparing you for the promise. Although we cannot see God in action, that doesn't mean He isn't acting on our behalf. Therefore, we must hold on to the promises of God. If God said it, it shall come to pass.
