

Mother Mary Ann Norris Scholarship

Mrs. Mary Ann Norris, affectionately known as Mother Norris, was an avid educator. She graduated with a Bachelor of Science in Education from Morgan State University and she furthered her academic education at Columbia University, New York, NY. Mother Norris was employed with the Board of Education of New York City as a Public School teacher in the Bronx and Brooklyn. She also became the Dean of Students at Intermediate School #33 (Mark Hopkins Junior High School). She retired from the Board of Education in 1986, however, she continued her life's journey as a First Lady and later an Episcopal Supervisor. Mother Mary married Bishop Richard Franklin Norris on December 21, 1968, and through their union, they bore two sons. The Rev. Richard Franklin Norris, II and Rev. Marcellus Alexander Norris. She served as the Episcopal Supervisor of the 14th, 1st, and 7th Episcopal Districts. Mother Norris was known for her love of God, sense of humor, and love for her family.
